Families Plus – serving children who suffer from deficient care, discord in the home, early trauma, chronic poverty, parental desertion, and behavior problems. Families Plus supports children who live in homes with few resources, little stability, and gaps in positive role modeling. 874-0464

Delta Family Resource Center – supports and assists parents in enriching their child's life. FRC helps strengthen the relationships between families and community agencies such as parent education, community resource referrals (Medicaid/CHP+) and ongoing family education. 874-9517
